Curated Exhibitions

The primary focus of my research program is curatorial practice using the holdings of the LSU Textile & Costume Museum. According to Green et al., “Curated fashion exhibitions are places where research practice, creative design, storytelling, and aesthetics converge...curators engage in a rigorous research process communicated through a creative design (i.e., the fashion exhibition).”¹ The presentations of artifacts engage students, alumni, community members, and donors. The curated fashion exhibition, for me, is a place where scholarship, pedagogy, and public outreach converge, fostering a sense of belonging among diverse communities and ultimately generating interest in both the LSU Textile & Costume Museum and the Department of Textiles, Apparel Design, and Merchandising.

Dressing Louisiana: *Histoires de la mode de la Louisiane*. On view now until March 6, 2026. Featuring over forty ensembles with related accessories, this curation of objects reflects the history of Louisiana from a sartorial perspective. Included are works by designers and artists from Louisiana, Mardi Gras, the First Lady of Louisiana fashion, LSU athletic apparel, and clothing worn by notable Louisianians such as Buckskin Bill, actress Donna Douglas, Rose McConnell Long, and Orene Muse. The joie de vivre de Louisiane is captured in this assemblage of objects telling unique histories of the spirit of our great state.

COLOR ME FASHION. March 23-August 15, 2025, at the LSU Textile & Costume Museum. Featuring forty-eight looks with over forty-six coordinating accessories spanning c.1890 to 1990, the exhibition visually organizes disparate objects across time, space, and place through the power of color theory. A stunning array of both European and American designer pieces, including the work of Norman Norell, Stephen Burrows, Chanel, Lanvin, Oscar de la Renta, Jacques Doucet, Balmain, and many more, were in the exhibition inspired by the Hindu festival of Holi, which centers on color to celebrate spring, rebirth, and the universal triumph of good over evil.

Coming Home: Geoffrey Beene. May 5, 2024 – January 24, 2025, at the LSU Textile & Costume Museum. This was the largest exhibition staged in the history of TCM and featured 92 garments from the collection of donor Sylvia R. Karasu, M.D. The exhibition celebrated the legacy of Geoffrey Beene, a native Louisianian, and included artifacts representing the entire span of Mr. Beene's career from the 1960s through the early 2000s, supplemented with fashion sketches and donor ephemera. - May 5, 2024: Exhibition opening with a panel I moderated, including donor Sylvia R. Karasu, M.D., and former Senior Vice President and Chief Operating Officer of Geoffrey Beene LLC, Mr. Russell Nardoza.
- August 30, 2024: *Happy Birthday!* A celebration with cake and champagne of what would have been Mr. Beene's 100th birthday.

Coming Home: Geoffrey Beene – *Southern Reflections*. April 26, 2024 – August 30, 2024, at the LSU Museum of Art. An additional exhibition of 24 garments, fashion sketches, and a tea set designed by Mr. Beene for Swid-Powell was installed at the LSU Museum of Art. These artifacts reflected Mr. Beene's southern design vernacular, including flowers of the south, familiar fabrications such as linen and seersucker, and patterns or prints such as gingham, checks, and

polka dots. The logistics of staging this offsite exhibition were extensive; condition reports for all garments were required before leaving TCM, and mannequins and dress forms had to be moved from TCM to LSU MOA. Costume installation is quite different than hanging an object on a wall. This collaborative exhibition required significant time to navigate new work relationships and differing approaches to curation and installation.

- June 13, 2024: *A Closer Look: Geoffrey Beene* – public lecture at the LSU Museum of Art.

Women Fashioning Women. October 1, 2023 – March 28, 2024, at the LSU Textile & Costume Museum. Exhibition of 54 garments and related accessories ranging from a Jeanne Paquin couture ensemble c. 1905 to jackets made by Martha Gottwald for LSU Women's Basketball coach Kim Mulkey during the 2022 championship season. More than forty different women designers of the twentieth and twenty-first centuries were represented in the show. Specialized mounts were required for antique and valuable garments, such as a 1926 Lanvin robe de style and a c. 1905 Jeanne Paquin velvet bodice and skirt. A c. 1922 Sadie Nemser dress was extensively conserved with the application of interior panels to stabilize shredding silk with the assistance of a graduate student, and various other repairs occurred for multiple garments on display, providing valuable training related to textile conservation. Several graduate and undergraduate students assisted with conservation, curating, installing this show, furthering my mission to include students in museum activities to enrich their learning experiences in TAM. - October 1, 2024: *Exhibition Opening and Annual Meeting of the Friends of the LSU Textile & Costume Museum*. Over 100 guests were in attendance. Refreshments were served, and a silent auction was held to support the museum.
- November 5, 2024: *Sunday, Champagne & San Carlin* – a celebration of legendary local women entrepreneurs Linda Ward-Dalton and Carla Jumonville, who started San Carlin, a luxury evening wear business in Baton Rouge in the 1980s. Guests came in eveningwear, had their photo taken before a step & repeat with Linda and Carla, and enjoyed cake and champagne. Racks of evening dresses on loan from Carla and Linda were on display and ultimately were donated to TCM (47 pieces).
- March 3, 2024: *Chapeaux*, a local women-owned millinery business, sold hats onsite.
